This assignment consists in writing a **5-7 philosophy page paper** on a topic that interests you. You should develop the ideas from your "paper outline/draft" on the basis of my feedback.

What should a philosophy paper do? Typically, a philosophy paper advances a certain thesis and attempts to defend the thesis with well-supported arguments.

What is a good philosophy paper? A good philosophy papers proceeds with rigor, clarity, precision, and originality. Rigorous argumentation, clarity of exposition, precision of language, and originality of ideas are essential ingredients for a good philosophy paper. You will be graded on the basis of those four criteria.

How should a philosophy paper be written and structured? A philosophy paper should be your own literary creation, so you can give to it the literary form and shape you prefer. Be an inspired and creative writer! Typically, a good philosophy paper consists of five parts:

- 1. an introduction which sets up the question of the paper and formulates the thesis;
- 2. a body of the paper which develops the main argument;
- 3. some objections to your main argument,
- 4. replies in defense of your main argument;
- 5. a conclusion which formulates the open questions and identifies the remaining weak points in your argument.

Be intellectually honest! In a philosophy paper, it is completely fine to recognize that your argument has weaknesses. It is better to openly acknowledge weaknesses in your argument rather than be silent about them.
