## PHI243/POL312 - PHILOSOPHY OF LAW/JURISPRUDENCE

## GRADED ASSIGNMENT #3 - Due April 28 Due April 21

This assignment asks you to compose a <u>philosophical dialogue</u>. This is not a mere succession of conflicting opinions. It is an exchange between <u>two interlocutors</u> who disagree with one another, and offer reasons and arguments in support of their claims. Each interlocutor strives to offer the <u>best arguments</u> in support of her position, and at the same time, raise the best objections to the arguments of the other side.

## Desiderata:

- ∘ 5-7 page long
- o focuses on a well-defined philosophical question
- o draws from the course readings on law and morality
- o demonstrates independent and creative thinking
- o elegantly and clearly written
- o consists of a detailed, precise and well-reasoned discussion
- o contains clear definitions of the terminology used
- o contains the strongest arguments in defense of a thesis
- o contains the strongest objections against the same thesis

Prompts are on the next page.

**Prompt 1:** Compose a dialogue between Antigone and Socrates on whether disobeying the law of the state can be legitimate or not. Use vivid examples if possible, beginning with Antigone's case and Socrates' case.

**Prompt 2:** Modify Plato's *Crito*. Make Crito's arguments for why Socrates should escape from prison more cogent. Create a fictional Crito who is less deferential to Socrates than he is in Plato's dialogue. Compose a dialogue in which Crito is able to give a hard time—philosophically speaking—to Socrates.

**Prompt 3:** Compose a dialogue between Hart and Fuller either on the topic of the penumbra or the topic of Nazi laws and unjust laws. The first part of the dialogue will be a summary of the objections and replies from the readings. The second part of the dialogue will instead contain your own new ideas.

**Prompt 4:** Come up with your topic and characters for a dialogue that is relevant to the course topic "law and morality".

I encourage you to discuss your ideas with me, through e-mail or in person, before you start writing your dialogue.

**NB:** Prerequisite for this assignment is a "PASS" on all the pass/fail assignments so far.
