- (f) The Athenian diplomats say that appealing to what is right, dissociated from the reality of one's own military force, is empty talk. Do you agree? Motivate your answer.
- (g) Think of a historical event, past or contemporary, similar to the confrontation between the Athenians and the Melians. Briefly describe the parallelism between the two.
- (h) If you were to summarize what you learnt from the Melian dialogue, what would you say? If you think you learnt nothing, feel free to say so, but do tell me why.
